Fear is the Beginning of Wisdom!

Psalm 111:10 [Amplified Bible] "The reverent fear and worship of the Lord [Jehovah, the self existent One or Eternal] is the beginning of wisdom and skill, the preceding and the first essential, the prerequisite of them. A good understanding, wisdom and meaning have all those who do the will of the Lord. Their praise of Him endures for ever."

Within this one verse in The Christian Bible we find the keys for abundant eternal life.

An eternal life in the presence of our Creator and all that such a life will bring to us in joy and satisfaction.

The fear of our Creator God does bring with it all we could ever desire for all time.

Proverbs 1:7 [Amplified Bible] "The reverent and worshipful fear of the Lord is the beginning and the principal and choice part of knowledge, that is, its starting point and its essence; but fools despise skilful and godly wisdom, instruction and discipline."
