

# Psalm 114

**The truth about the Creator God as expanded in Psalm 113 now receives a powerful illustration in His relationship with Israel.**

**Psalms 114:1** [New King James] *“When Israel went out of Egypt, the house of Jacob from a people of strange language,”*

The Creator God identifies with the outcast, [**Psalms 113:7**].

**Psalms 114:2** [New King James] *“Judah became His sanctuary, and Israel His dominion.”*

The Creator God is sovereign over all that He has created, including human beings, they became His “sanctuary,” His “dominion.”

**When the Creator God redeems a person from deserved eternal death, [Romans 6:23] through the substitute death of Jesus Christ, [1 Corinthians 15:3; John 3:16-17] that person becomes the property of Jesus Christ, purchased by Him, [Acts 20:28; 1 Peter 1:18-19].**

**Jesus Christ also then dwells in such a redeemed person.**

**John 14:15-18** [New King James] *“If you love Me, keep My commandments. And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; **I will come to you.**”*

Note the final words of this scripture, *“I will come to you.”*

Jesus Christ speaking, done through the active presence of the Holy Spirit, the *“Spirit of Christ,”* [**Romans 8:9**].

**Psalms 114:3-4** [New King James] *“The sea saw it and fled; Jordan turned back. The mountains skipped like rams, the little hills like lambs.”*

**Israel’s Redeemer is the world’s Creator was shown by the marvels that attended the exodus from Egypt.**

Dividing of Red Sea, [**Exodus 14:2-30**].

The stopping of the flow of the Jordan River, [**Joshua 3:1-17**].

The giving of the law at Sinai, [**Exodus 19:16-18**].

**Psalms 114:5-6** [New King James] *“What ails you, O sea, that you fled? O Jordan, that you turned back? O mountains, that you skipped like rams? O little hills, like lambs?”*

**These miracles underline the truth that the Creator God completes what He starts to do.**

The Creator God brought His people out of Egypt, [spiritually slavery to sin], but also brought them into the Promised Land.

The fact that the Creator God can do all that He promises shows His power and supremacy, whereby nothing can resist Him or be a barrier that stands in His way, [**Matthew 19:26; Luke 1:37; Luke 18:27**].

**Philippians 1:6** [New King James] *“being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ;”*

**As far as God’s part is concerned He will complete our spiritual creation and entering into the created family of God.**

**Psalms 114:7-8** [New King James] *“Tremble, O earth, at the presence of the Lord, at the presence of the God of Jacob, Who turned the rock into a pool of water, the flint into a fountain of waters.”*

To tremble at the Creator God’s presence as illustrated in the great powers involved in the sustaining of the whole universe, [**Colossians 1:13-17**].

**Romans 1:18-22** [New King James] *“For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown it to them. For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse, because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Professing to be wise, they became fools,”*

**When we do not accept the Triune God as our Creator and Lord we incur His wrath which may not be immediate because He has in great wisdom allowed Satan to blind most people to the message of salvation, [2 Corinthians 4:4] so they can experience in each generation just what it is like to live without the influence of the Creator God in their lives.**

**The last two verses of this Psalm remind us that the redeeming work of the Creator God not only begins with our being freed from the slavery of sin, and eventually enter into the created family of God, but that He also provides all that we need as “pilgrims” on our human journey, [Exodus 17:1-7].**
