

Psalm 134

This Psalm is about the Levites who serve as temple watchmen during the night.

Psalms 134:1-3 [New King James] *“Behold, bless the LORD, all you servants of the LORD, who by night stand in the house of the LORD! Lift up your hands in the sanctuary, and bless the LORD. The LORD who made heaven and earth bless you from Zion!”*

The worship of the Creator God continued both day and night in the Temple, [**1 Chronicles 9:33**].

Their task was a constant worship of thanksgiving and prayers of adoration, a fitting work for servants of the Creator God.

This is an earthly reflection of what happens at the Creator God’s throne in heaven.

Revelation 4:2-11 [New King James] *“Immediately I was in the Spirit; and behold, a throne set in heaven, and One sat on the throne. And He who sat there was like a jasper and a sardius stone in appearance; and there was a rainbow around the throne, in appearance like an emerald. Around the throne were twenty-four thrones, and on the thrones I saw twenty-four elders sitting, clothed in white robes; and they had crowns of gold on their heads. And from the throne proceeded lightnings, thunderings, and voices. Seven lamps of fire were burning before the throne, which are the seven Spirits of God. Before the throne there was a sea of glass, like crystal. And in the midst of the throne, and around the throne, were four living creatures full of eyes in front and in back. The first living creature was like a lion, the second living creature like a calf, the third living creature had a face like a man, and the fourth living creature was like a flying eagle. The four living creatures, each having six wings, were full of eyes around and within. And they do not rest day or night, saying: ‘Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, Who was and is and is to come!’ Whenever the living creatures give glory and honour and thanks to Him who sits on the throne, who lives forever and ever, the twenty-four elders fall down before Him who sits on the throne and worship Him who lives forever and ever, and cast their crowns before the throne, saying: ‘You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power; for You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created.’”*

The vision of the Creator God’s throne in heaven given by Jesus Christ to the apostle John, [**Revelation 1:1-3**].

Ephesians 5:19-21 [New King James] *“speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, submitting to one another in the fear of God.”*

Personal and public worship are part of the unifying of the people of God into a created family of God.

Whenever we worship our Creator God remember we are joining a great number of spirit beings in heaven and a great number of humble human beings on earth who have all come to love and adore the eternal God who is our Creator and Sustainer, [**Psalms 134:3**].
