

Does God Know What You Will Do Tomorrow?

God knows everything so God must know what you are going to do tomorrow!

No, not necessarily.

Some people believe that they have been predestined to be saved while others are inevitably predestined to be lost!

Such people have, unfortunately, totally misunderstood the scriptures on the subject of predestination found in God's Word, the Christian Bible.

The Word of God, the Christian Bible, certainly does show that the Eternal God is able to decide what happens in the future and reserves the right to override any individual's plans.

The Creator God has recorded in the history of humanity found in the Christian Bible His intervention in the course of certain events. He has had to make sure that the right people are in the right place at the right time in order that some aspects of His master plan for humanity can be fulfilled.

But this is **not** God's usual way of dealing with human beings and it is unlikely to be our personal experience. Most of us have **not** been called by the Creator God for some special individual mission or to perform great miracles.

We are, as Christians, ordinary people whose minds have been opened to the truth of the Creator God, when the vast majority of people have been allowed by God to be blinded to the truth by Satan, [2 Corinthians 4:4].

In one sense God has intervened in your life by the fact you have visited this website and shown an interest in understanding Who and What the Creator God is, and what is His interest in you individually.

Such a response shows that you are now part of His plan, but if that plan is to succeed the Creator God cannot plot every move you make from now onwards. **So He does not want to know what you are going to do tomorrow**, but He would like to know, but **the choice is always ours**.

1 John 4:15-16, 18 [New King James] *"Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. And we have known and believed the love that God has for us. God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God in him." ... "There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love."*

The Creator God is love itself, everything He thinks and does is motivated by love, and His desire is that we come to love Him.

The Greek word translated "love" is "*agapé*" meaning a spontaneous love, irrespective of the "rights" or response of the recipient, [Romans 5:6] a sacrificial love, [John 3:16-17] that puts aside personal desires, [Philippians 2:5-8] to love the object of that love.

We find the original reason for the creation of human beings in God's Word, the Christian Bible, [Genesis 1:26-27]. This is a two-stage plan. First, humans are all created in the "image" of God. The Hebrew word used is "tselem" meaning resemblance, shadow, outward form, a material representation; note only this is what all humans from Adam onwards are.

The second part "likeness" is a different Hebrew word, "demûwth" meaning manner, attributes that is character and as we know character takes time in the presence of the person whose character we wish to reflect.

Therefore every human being will eventually have this intimate relationship with the Creator God who is love, through the active indwelling of the Holy Spirit who is one Person of the Triune God.

Galatians 5:22-25 [New King James] *"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law. And those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit."*

These "fruits" are the characteristics of the Triune God, the first being love.

If the words we read in the Christian Bible are starting to "come alive" to you, if you are beginning to act on what you are learning, then God is calling you now and is very concerned with what you choose to think and do in the future.

Jesus Christ is taking serious responsibility of being a Good Shepherd to you as one of God's elect at this time. He strives not to lose even one person that the Father has drawn to Him, [John 10:27-30].

So you can be sure that your Saviour Jesus Christ is watching over every aspect of your life carefully.

There is always the problem, because we have been given the ability to choose, and what we are going to do might be causing God some anxiety.

The Triune God must get to know those people He is at this time calling for their predestined time for salvation, just as we need to get to know Him.

Why?

One day the Creator God will change our mortal bodies into immortal so we can live forever, [1 Corinthians 15:50-58] in the created family of God, [that is the Kingdom of God, a family grown large], with responsibilities and authority over other people, [Revelation 20:4-6, 11-13].

All who are being called now in each generation will be among these "kings and priests" [Revelation 1:4-6] that is teachers and rulers, who serve all who have never even heard of the true Creator God and His Word, the Christian Bible.

The Triune God has given all His future created children freedom of choice to obey or disobey Him, otherwise the future kingdom would be full of pre-programmed, obedient, automatons instead of lively children who can share the joys of eternal life with Him.

John 17:3 [New King James] *"And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent."*

Getting to know our Creator God even more intimately.

How does the Triune God get to know us? –

Matthew 7:20 [New King James] *“Therefore by their fruits you will know them.”*

Our “fruits” are what we decide to do on a day-to-day basis. These actions will show our spiritual nature or our human nature.

Romans 6:1-8 [New King James] *“What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it? Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptised into Christ Jesus were baptised into His death? Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection, knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin. For he who has died has been freed from sin. Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him,”*

We will seek to live with and like our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Romans 6:9-13 [New King James] *“knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more. Death no longer has dominion over Him. For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God. Likewise you also, reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, that you should obey it in its lusts. **And do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God.**”*

“Instruments of righteousness” we begin to reflect the “likeness” of the Triune God, the very reason we have been given life.
