

Idle Words

Matthew 12:36 [Amplified Bible] *“But I tell you, on the day of judgement men will have to give account for every idle, inoperative, non-working word they speak.”*

Religion stands at the top as being among all fields of human interest the one addicted to words.

Nowhere else are there so many words yet too often few deeds to support them.

Our words must always have some reality corresponding to them.

This lack of reality among so many religious speakers and those who listen to them is disturbing.

Many speakers may talk about something that they have never personally experienced.

The reassuring drone of safe and familiar religious phrases seems to be enough to give the listeners an enjoyable sense of well-being.

The absence of reality may **not** even be noticed.

The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us.
