

The Three Stages Of Creating A Complete Human Being

Although human nature is rebellious against the Creator God and morally degenerate, it still stands at the top in the order of God's creation.

Human nature indicates that we have been created to use and perfect three things: think, worship and work.

Humans think –

This includes everything that intellect can do, from the simplest act to the creation of an oratorio or the founding of an empire.

This ability to observe, inquire, collect data and from it to reveal causes, laws and principles.

In this intellect humans stand easily supreme above all other creatures.

The domestication of the wild forces of physical nature, all has been done by the thinking human who dares to reach out into the unknown entertaining notions no-one has ever had before.

This driving force within humans begins in the nursery and go on through to the university and beyond.

Whatever institution that encourages human beings to think deserves the gratitude of the whole human race.

But thinking is **not** enough for the thinking brain in a human is limiting the peak that a human can reach.

Job 32:8 [NIV] *“But it is the spirit in a man, the breath of the Almighty, that gives him understanding.”*

This human spirit, that is placed by the Creator God in every human being lifts them into a higher plane, a spiritual, supernatural level of experience and life, [**Proverbs 20:27; 1 Corinthians 2:11**].

When a person becomes aware of this higher inexpressible realm, the natural response is give in to what is already within our nature, to worship this source of the supernatural, the divine being who is the Creator God.

Before a human spirit makes contact with God's Holy Spirit a person is far from complete.

Only after this union can a human being understand the very reason for their existence.

Through the union of our human spirit and the Holy Spirit, the very character of the Creator God can start to be developed.

Galatians 5:22-23 [NIV] *“But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.”*

Listed here are the very characteristics of the Creator God which are only developed through an intimate relationship with the Holy Spirit.

Every human being experiences this development of character on a physical level, when the children, through close and constant contact with their parents, take on their characters.

Romans 12:1-2 [NIV] *“Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God, this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is, his good, pleasing and perfect will.”*

It is only through the grateful sacrifice of our will and nature that this transformation of our character can develop.

We willingly crucify our former life and character to receive the grace of our Creator God and sustainer. [**Romans 6:3-4**]

We then seek to please our Creator God through this practical form of worship.

Through this relationship with our Creator God we can be prepared to receive the gift of eternal life.

John 17:3 [NIV] *“Now this is eternal life: that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.”*

A non-ending experience of getting to know and understand more the perfection and power of the Godhead.

A thinking and worshipping human being is still short of perfection until they become a working human being, who is working alongside God the Father and His Son Jesus Christ.

John 5:17 [NIV] *“Jesus said to them, ‘My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I, too, am working.’”*

This work that God the Father and Jesus Christ would do was prophesied by the Old Testament prophets.

Isaiah 61:1-2 [NIV] *“The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the LORD's favour and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn,”*

This was confirmed by Jesus Christ at the very beginning of His ministry in Nazareth.

Luke 4:16-21 [NIV] *“He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. And he stood up to read. The scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: ‘The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.’ Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him, and he began by saying to them, ‘Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.’”*

It is the work that every Christian is anointed to do with God the Father and Jesus Christ their Saviour.

No human being can be said to be complete physically who has **not** related their intellectual gifts to creative work.

But **no** work, however sacrificial, will be permanent unless it is geared to eternity.

Only what is done in a spirit of worship will last forever.

Only when the work being done is to honour the Creator God and bring blessings to other human beings will it last forever.

Let us consider what has been studied.

When a human being comes a thinking human being a great deal may be accomplished.

When the thinking human goes on to be a worshipping human a giant step towards perfection has been taken.

When the thinking and worshipping human has placed their whole personality to work to bring honour and glory to their Creator God, it will also bring a blessing to the rest of humanity.
